

CHS Dual Enrollment Program

What is Dual Enrollment?

A program in which colleges allow high school students to enroll and take coursework for college credit. Colleges cooperate with the student's high school to send over grades. The grades count for high school credit as well, and many dual enrollment classes can satisfy high school graduation requirements.

How does Dual Enrollment differ from Advanced Placement (AP)?

DUAL ENROLLMENT

Courses are taught by a college professor.

College credit guaranteed (if the student passes). It's still critical for the student to be forthcoming about his/her college plans after high school in order to make a wise decision about transferability of DE coursework.

Weighted with an extra 0.5 point by CHS (subject to change)

ADVANCED PLACEMENT (AP)

Courses are taught by a high school teacher.

Student must take AP exam and send scores to their colleges. It is up to the college to determine whether the passing score meets the criteria for awarding credit.

Weighted with an extra 1.0 point by CHS

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Minimum Requirements (Subject to Change)

- 3.0 Academic Unweighted GPA to take Academic Classes
- 2.5 Academic Unweighted GPA to take Technical Classes
- 11th or 12th Grade
- Must meet additional requirements set forth by the college.

Cost of Dual Enrollment

- The DE grant covers tuition and textbooks for up to 30 credit hours. Students are responsible for course fees.
- Georgia Dual Enrollment Course Directory
- Dual Enrollment funding does not impact the student's HOPE hours but can impact their eligibility.
