What is Title 1?

Title I, Part A, is the largest federally funded program under the Every Student Succeeds Act (ESSA). The purpose of Title I under ESSA is to ensure that <u>all</u> <u>children have a fair, equal, and significant</u> <u>opportunity to obtain a high-quality education</u> and reach, at a minimum, proficiency on challenging state academic achievement standards and state academic assessments.

What is Title 1?

- ► Title 1, Part A, has a strong focus on parental involvement and notification as it relates to:
 - Affording parents substantial and meaningful opportunities to participate in the education of their children
 - Ensuring that high-quality academic assessments, accountability systems, teacher preparation and training, curriculum and instructional materials are aligned with state academic standards so students, teachers, parents, and administrators can measure progress against common expectations for academic achievement.

What makes a Title I School?

- Title I provides federal funds to public schools with high numbers or percentages of economically disadvantaged students to help ensure that <u>all</u> <u>students</u> obtain a high-quality education.
- Schools with 40% or more of low-income families can develop Title I school-wide plans to serve all students.
- All Bartow County and Cartersville City Elementary and Middle Schools are Title I schools.

Purpose of Title I Funds

- ► To help academically or monetarily disadvantaged students meet state academic standards
 - Including neglected, migrant, & homeless students
- Money is used to provide services over and above that of a non-Title I school to all students regardless of income level.
- ► Title I money can be used in the areas of Reading, Language Arts, Math, Science and Social Studies

Title 1 – Professionally Qualified Staff

- Courses at CMS are taught by professionally qualified staff. We provide instruction by professionally qualified teachers who meet the standards established by the state of Georgia. If we have certification deficiencies, we provide a plan and support the acquisition of appropriate credentials in a timely fashion.
- Due to an enlarged population of gifted and accelerated students, our entire staff has received, or is working towards their gifted endorsement. We are currently aiding appropriate staff in their acquisition of the ESOL endorsement as well.

Title 1 – Professionally Qualified Staff

- The following is a list of strategies used to attract and retain high quality and highly qualified teachers to Cartersville Middle School:
 - Utilization of the Teach for Georgia resource provided by the Georgia Department of Education
 - Providing new teacher orientation prior to the beginning of a new school year
 - Providing an on-going new teacher induction program for new teachers with appropriate mentors
 - Setting aside a specific time each week for members of grade levels to meet as a group for planning purposes
 - Sending an administrative representative to regional job fairs
 - Offering a competitive salary and benefits package
 - Providing assistance from the administrative team, instructional support specialists, and school counselors
 - Offering the online teacher application program
 - Welcoming students in teaching colleges (Kennesaw State University, Brenau College, Berry College, Reinhardt University, and the University of Georgia) to come to CMS for field experiences, practicums, and student teaching.
 - Hiring graduates of the Cartersville City School System
