COURSE DESCRIPTION

This course is designed to help students improve their reading skills, reading proficiency, and reading fluency. We will use a variety of tailored instructional methods to help each student reach their highest potential.

STANDARDS:

ELAGSE 6RL10, 7RL10, 8RL10 By the end of the year, read and comprehend literature, including stories, dramas, and poems, in the grades 6-8 text complexity band proficiently, with scaffolding as needed at the high end of the range.

ELAGSE 6RI10, 7RI0, 8RI10: By the end of the year, read and comprehend literary nonfiction in the grades 6-8 text complexity band proficiently, with scaffolding as needed at the high end of the range.

WHAT'S AHEAD:

This year, we will focus on reading strategies and use interventions to help students build reading stamina, improve comprehension and understanding, and boost reading fluency.

GRADING:

The final grade is computed from a combination of summative assessments of standards-based assignments (tests, essays, and projects) and formative evidence of learning assignments (daily work and quizzes). The grades will be averaged based on the weights listed below.


GRADE BREAKDOWN

Interventions

We will use the following web-based, system approved programs as directed to improve the reading skills mentioned in this syllabus:

- 1. **iReady** is an online program for reading and/or mathematics that will help your student's teacher(s) determine your student's needs, personalize their learning, and monitor progress throughout the school year. i-Ready allows your teacher(s) to meet your student exactly where they are and provides data to increase your student's learning gains. i-Ready consists of two parts: Diagnostic and Personalized Instruction.
- 2. Read Naturally is a supplemental reading program that designed to improve reading fluency, accuracy, and comprehension for readers in all grades. Students read passages on their reading level, going to prescribed steps. The process is requires computer interaction and student/teacher interaction. There is also a writing component.
