#### **Program Description**

No partial application packets will be accepted. Application packets can be submitted between January 13, 2025 and February 21, 2025. No late application packets will be received or considered for admission. Applications can be mailed to or dropped off at CHS (see page #7).

To be considered for admission, a complete application packet must be submitted:

Completed Admissions Application - can be found on the Cartersville High School website
Three (3) Short Essay Questions (typed) - The response must be written solely by the student.
<b>Program Contract</b> – initialed/signed by the student and a parent/guardian.
Capstone Contract – initialed/signed by the student and a parent/guardian.
Milestones Scores, Attendance Report, Discipline Report, Report Card Review – CHS will
obtain these records for all applicants to be reviewed by the committee. Students are <u>NOT</u> required
to request these documents from their current school.
<b>Submit Admissions Application Packet,</b> in its entirety, to the STEAM Prep Program at CHS between January 13 – February 21, 2025.
Student Interviews – to be scheduled after February 21.
Please be prepared to answer the following questions in your interview:
• Tell us about a time when you had to solve a complex problem with limited resources. How did

- lid you approach the challenge? What did you learn from the experience?
- Describe an instance when you handled differences in opinion or conflict when working with others on a team project? What role did you play and how did you contribute to the success of the project?
- STEAM is about thinking outside the box. Can you give an example of a time you approached a problem differently from others? What form of technology, tools, or software did you use to complete the project? How did it enhance your final product?



Directions: Choose 3 of the prompts below and write 250 – 350 words per prompt.

These responses must be the original work of the student. AI generated material is NOT original work. The submitted document must be typed in MLA format.

- 1. The STEAM Prep is designed for students interested in math, science, engineering, fine arts, and/or healthcare. What aspects of these subjects are you interested in and why? Include personal examples and anecdotes to support each part of your answer.
- 2. What is a problem in our community that needs to be addressed and how would you solve it? Using the CHS STEAM Problem Solving Approach (Ask, Imagine, Plan, Create, Improve, and Share), identify the problem, consider potential solutions, and design something that would serve to remedy or solve the issue/problem.
- 3. Many of our common household items can be reused and re-purposed. Imagine that you have an empty milk jug. What could you make with this item? How could you reuse it for a new purpose?
- 4. Draw a sketch of a machine that you think would help your classroom. Now, explain in writing how your machine would be built and also how it would work.
- 5. Some adults like to claim that video games are a waste of time and energy, but many students feel that they learn valuable lessons and develop important skills while gaming. Do you feel video games are valuable? What have you learned while playing your favorite games?
- 6. You have been given the choice by your teacher to write code for a phone APP or design a new form of AI technology. Which do you choose? Why?
- 7. Given the choice, would you write a song, a poem, or computer code? Explain why.

#### **Capstone Contract with Standards and Expectations**

#### **CAPSTONE EXPECTATION**

Accreditation for STEAM certification requires all students to complete a Capstone project. Students in the CHS STEAM Prep Program will complete a research-based Capstone project during their eleventh-grade year, which culminates in a final presentation of their Capstone project to a panel of community judges. The Capstone project is a requirement to earn the STEAM seal and stole for graduation.

#### MISSION AND OVERVIEW

The Capstone Project is designed to equip STEAM students with the skills needed for lifelong learning and active, productive citizenship. It provides students with the opportunity to plan, complete, and present a self-directed culminating project. Capstone projects are interdisciplinary, requiring students to apply knowledge and skills from various subject areas while showcasing key aspects of their K-12 learning. This experience encourages students to think critically, solve complex problems, and develop essential skills such as public speaking, research, media literacy, teamwork, planning, self-sufficiency, and goal setting skills that will prepare them for success in college and future careers.

#### STANDARDS AND SKILLS

The STEAM Prep Capstone Project requires students to demonstrate core standards and skills, which include:

- 1. Thinking critically and creatively
- 2. Demonstrating flexibility and initiative
- 3. Conducting analysis and research, including proper citation of references
- 4. Communicating ideas through multiple modalities
- 5. Using technology effectively

#### **PROCESS**

Students who choose to fulfill their final English credit through AP English Literature and Composition will complete their Capstone project as part of that class. Students opting for the dual enrollment program will complete their Capstone project as an independent study. This will involve meeting with the teacher facilitator during office hours, completing all Capstone assignments by the same deadlines as the AP Literature students, and presenting their Capstone project to a panel of community judges during the Capstone event, either in December or May. As the Capstone is a requirement of the STEAM Prep Program, students who do not complete the Capstone Project and all its components will not receive the STEAM Prep seal or stole at graduation.

#### CAPSTONE ACKNOWLEDGEMENT
