

The FLEX Program is a specialized instructional environment for Cartersville High School students that have been referred to the program by counselors and administrative staff. This path is for our $9^{th} - 12^{th}$ grade students that require more individualized attention to their academic and/or social-emotional needs. The FLEX learning model is a 1:1 technology blended learning environment with both online and in-person instruction with a focus on differentiation and project-based learning. Learning is also enhanced by providing interventions that support each student's academic and social-emotional needs.
