Foster Care numbers dropped from 200 to 115. Not sure why? This does not include "family preservation." May be 20-30% higher. DFCS custody

Absenteeism is a chronic issue.

Lower numbers at City. One SSW per school helps! Value of Education? Woodland reports 49% of students with chronic absences. More severe with teens. Can we find ways to encourage stronger attendance at lower level? What can we do to help catch these students up when they do return?

Child or Parent?

Under eleven, it is a parent responsibility. 11-14 range. It is a mixture of both! Above 14, it is on the child.

85% of DFCS cases are the result of drug use (primarily methamphetamine)

Drug rehab/ treatment can take 6-8 months after program initiation.

DFCS determines best placement, but law encourages child to stay with their homebased school
