Assuring them that based on results of investigation, there was no intent to harm anyone at any time during this event. Members were very supportive and complimentary of the efforts of Ms. Tierce, CHS Admin and law enforcement to ensure the safety of all students and staff.

New Pathway – CHS will offer a new pathway to students. This will be known as the Government and National Security pathway. It will target students interested in leadership, civic engagement and local government.

Dual Enrollment Credit Weight – A handout was given to members to take home for review to be discussed at next meeting. The handout outlines CCS board policy for quality points given to AP, Honors and Dual Enrollment classes. Ms. Tierce asked for feedback regarding the current policy and any changes they feel need to be made.
